

Gabriel Trenzado Falcón

Director General of Cooperativas Agro-alimentarias de España

Gabriel holds a degree in Law and is a specialist in Community Law from the Jean Monnet Chair at the University of Salamanca; and in Political Science from the University of Granada. He holds a Master's degree in Taxation and Cooperative Accounting from the University of Valencia.

During his university education he participated in the Erasmus programme with stays at Queen's University Belfast (Law) and Université Libre de Bruxelles (Political Science). For eight years he has been a lecturer on the Master's Degree in Agri-Food Business Management (MGEA) at the Fundación Láfer, University of Nebrija.

Since 2001 he has been a member of the technical team of Cooperativas Agroalimentarias de España and, in 2022, he was appointed Director General.

From 2002 to 2008, he was head of the Organisation's Brussels delegation, then Director of Technical Services, EU Relations and International at headquarters.

His experience in key issues in the agri-food sector has made him a member of several Civil Dialogue Groups of the European Commission, and he actively participates in COPA-COGECA's Working Groups. He is currently Vice-Chairman of the COPACOGECA Food Chain Working Group and a member of the EU Food Chain Committee (AFCO).

In addition, Gabriel Trenzado represents Cooperativas Agro-alimentarias de España in various forums such as the General Council of Interprofessional Agrifood Organisations and the Observatory of the Food Chain.

In 2016 he received the Order of Agricultural Merit awarded by the French Government.

Enrico Letta

Dean of IE School of Politics, Economics and Global Affairs and President of the Jacques Delors Institute

Enrico Letta was Prime Minister of Italy from 2013 to 2014. He is currently Dean of the IE School of Politics, Economics, and Global Affairs at IE University and President of the Jacques Delors Institute.

In September 2023, the European institutions commissioned him to prepare a Report on the Future of the Single Market.

From March 2021 to February 2023, he was National Secretary of the Democratic Party in Italy. Previously, from 2015 to 2021, he was Dean of the School of International Affairs at Sciences Po Paris. In 2019, he was appointed president of the Association of Professional Schools of International Affairs (APSIA) for a two-year term. Previously, Letta was Minister for EU Affairs (1998–1999), Minister for Industry, Trade and Crafts (2000), Minister for Industry and Foreign Trade (2000–2001) and Under-Secretary of State under Prime Minister Romano Prodi (2006–2008).

He holds an MA in IPE from the University of Manchester and has been a research fellow at the Institute of International Relations at the Pontifical Catholic University of Rio de Janeiro, the Institute of World Economics and Politics at the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences in Beijing, the Alfaisal University Business in Riyadh and the Mercator Institute for China Studies (MERICS) in Berlin. He is founder and coordinator of the European Think Tank Network on China (ETNC).

Since 2012, he has been working as a Professor teaching undergraduate courses at the Faculties of Medicine (Legal and Forensic Medicine and Toxicology, and Fundamentals of Research and Bioethics), Health Sciences (Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy) and Law (Criminology), and postgraduate courses on gender violence at the Universities of Valencia, UNED, Pablo Olavide in Seville and the University of Chile.

Since 1988 he has taken part as a researcher in 12 research projects on the application of DNA analysis to Legal and Forensic Medicine within the field of Criminalistics, biological investigation of paternity and maternity, and human identification, especially in the case of missing persons. He has also been a member of 2 research groups on gender violence, and advisor to commissions

on gender violence of national (Congress of Deputies, Senate, CGPJ) and international bodies (WHO, EU Institute for Gender Equality (EIGE), United Nations (UN Women and OHCHR)).

From 2015 to 2019 he was director of the Secretariat for Equality and Work-Life Balance at the University of Granada.

Member of the Gender Gap Advisory Council of the Ministry of Inclusion, Social Security and Migration.

He has published 84 articles in international and national scientific journals, author of 10 books and 32 book chapters. Director of doctoral theses on forensic DNA and gender violence. He has made more than 77 contributions to congresses, several of them as a guest speaker, and has been invited to conferences, working commissions, working groups... on gender violence by different types of administrations and organisations. His latest book is "La refundación del machismo", published in July 2023.

He has 5 teaching periods and 3 six-year research periods.

As a coach, together with Rafa Nadal, he has achieved one of the most successful track records in the history of the international tennis circuit:

- 74 tournaments in total
- 16 grand slams including 10 Roland Garros, 3 US Opens, 2 Winblendon tournaments and 1 Australian Open.
- 4 Davis Cups
- · 2 Olympic Games

He currently combines his work as an ambassador for the Rafa Nadal Academy with his role as a lecturer, giving talks to sports coaches, young people and companies.

Some of the topics he discusses in his lecture are: managing adversity, commitment, self-demand and resilience, but, above all, not looking for excuses and not overestimating successes or magnifying defeats..
